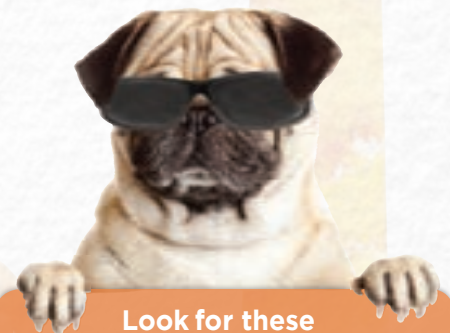

Licenses in European Patent Litigation

Continuing the plenary session, the first part of this workshop will explore PC issues surrounding pre-trial evidence and discovery, timing, cost, and available remedies. The second part of this workshop will focus specifically on the roles of licenses in European patent litigation including the UPC. Licenses currently involve questions of national law and of European law. The UPC intends to add further procedural rules that may have an impact on the role that licenses play in patent litigation. The questions to be addressed to the panel may include licensing implication of multiple European subsidiaries, license defense in patent infringement litigation (FRAND): the position of the European Commission, European Court of Justice and national practices; FRAND defense under the UPC procedural rules; impact of the FRAND defense on remedies requested by the patentee, impact of the UPC on license agreements (rules for opting out, use of the UPC vs. national law...), impact of bankruptcies on existing licenses, impact of patent sales on enforcement under national law and under the UPC.

Practical Considerations In Litigating Standard Essential Patents

Courts recently are addressing issues related to litigating patents alleged to cover an industry standard ("standard essential patents" or "SEPs"). Courts are facing and developing unique procedural and substantive law regarding SEPs, such as (1) determining a reasonable and non-discriminatory (RAND) royalty, (2) when to determine a RAND royalty (e.g., bifurcate case to first determine RAND, stand-alone RAND action); (3) the specificity required in pleading SEP defenses; (4) establishing whether patent "hold-up" or "hold-out" have occurred; (5) availability of damages and equitable relief; (6) who decides RAND or breach of RAND obligation (judge or jury) or (7) whether and when to determine if patent is essential to a standard or infringed. This program will go over those procedural and substantive issues, including practical insights by a panel of judges with experience presiding over SEP litigations.

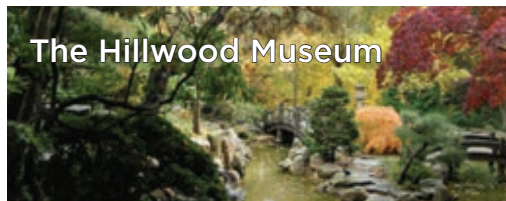
