

Addressing hate speech and extremism

We gathered a panel of experts to discuss the complexity of addressing hate speech and extremism globally with PeaceTech Lab. Our conversation included the following esteemed guests:



To compliment PeaceTech Lab's work on hate speech, 80+ Hogan Lovells' attorneys and staff with the direction and online speech experience of partners, Christelle Coslin (Paris) and Christopher Wolf (Washington, D.C.), collectively published a special report in December 2021, "The Global Regulation of Online Hate: A Survey of Applicable Laws," to analyze the extent to which laws govern online hate speech under international law and a specifically examining the legislation in 23 jurisdictions.

Combating misinformation

Separating truth from fiction

False or misleading claims affect us all. Bad information promotes hate, damages people's health, and hurts democracy. We teamed up with Full Fact, a team of independent fact checkers and campaigners, to join the fight against misinformation.

Full Fact wants to get better at automatically detecting people repeating things that they have previously fact checked, so that each fact check Full Fact writes can work as hard as possible. 60+ volunteers from across our three regions (Americas, Asia-Pacific, and EMEA) supported their Claim Challenge to better train their artificial intelligence in finding repetitions of false and harmful claims, even if different words are used to describe it. It will help Full Fact to see more precisely where patterns of bad information are forming and ultimately, enable their fact checkers to fight the spread of bad information in the most effective way.

Full Fact also trained 70+ global participants on how to spot misinformation in the news and on social media using key critical skills. The training covered the landscape of mis and disinformation, the principles of fact checking, and learning some of the key online tools to help interrogate and verify sources of information.

Advancing racial justice

We successfully delivered Road to Equal Justice workshops that provided virtual technology and media trainings for racial justice advocates across the country.

Sessions were held in cities across the United States, including Baltimore, Boston, Denver, Louisville, Miami, and Washington, D.C.

Our people developed city profiles exploring important racial justice topics relevant to each city that served as fundamental foundations for designing workshops. Overall, 448 participants representing 243 organizations benefited from the Road to Equal Justice initiative.



While the pandemic limited most of the project to an online platform, the last Road to Equal Justice initiative held in Louisville, Kentucky, earlier this year was the first in-person series. Our Hogan Lovells' Head of Global Business Services Center in Louisville, Bill Ball, and our local Compliance Analyst, Nasir Hassan, assisted PeaceTech Lab with building local support and relationships for the initiative, while our local Design team colleagues, Tessa Wilkerson, and Elizabeth Hardesty, conducted a workshop for participants on "Creating Effective Flyers." Our Senior Learning and Development Coordinator, Sharlis Montgomery, had the pleasure of moderating the event at the Mohammed Ali Center, leading and participating in critical discussions related to racial equity, local community building following the death of Breonna Taylor, and technology's role in our learning and solutions.

Sharlis reflected on her experience:

• To kick us off, we had a powerful and inspiring keynote address from Maryum Ali. She embodies the spirit and persona of her father [Muhammad Ali]. She shared how his work impacted everyone around him. His life motto of 'Simple Kindness' is something that stuck with me.
