Keith is Head of Africa Philanthropy at Save the Children UK. Keith's expertise is in creating visionary transformational relationships with African philanthropists, businesses and influencers aimed at addressing challenges that affect the most disadvantaged children across Africa. He has raised over £30 million as a fundraiser and recently received a donation for Save the Children of £10 million from a single African donor - the largest ever given across the continent.

Keith's expertise is in harnessing mutually beneficial interests between Africa and the rest of the world and by setting up and leading the inaugural Africa Advisory Board (the first of its kind anywhere in the world) for Save the Children he actively operated across most of Sub-Saharan countries.

Before joining Save the Children, Keith set up the fundraising function at JUSTICE, a leading legal research charity in the United Kingdom for judges and legal practitioners and established the international institutional fundraising programme at Ark, the international education charity. He also founded Volunteer Visits, a social enterprise that offers international visitors the opportunity to give back to rural communities in Uganda.

He holds a Masters in Laws from the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) and a Bachelor of Laws from Makerere University in Uganda. Before moving to the United Kingdom from his native Uganda, Keith worked for The International Republican Institute, a strategy group that helped parliamentary candidates prepare and stand for office; with considerable success in getting them elected. Prior to that he was Director of the Uganda's Law Society's Legal Aid Project and Chair of the Legal Aid Service Providers' Network. Keith is a Fellow of the Ford Foundation and a member of JUSTICE, the UK's leading legal membership.
